

### **GREENWALL FACULTY SCHOLARS PROGRAM IN BIOETHICS**

The Greenwall Faculty Scholars Program in Bioethics is a career development initiative that supports original research by outstanding junior faculty members to help resolve important policy and clinical dilemmas at the intersection of ethics and the life sciences.

### **AWARD PROGRAM**

Specific areas of interest in the life sciences can include human cloning, stem cell research, gene therapy, and new information technologies. Candidates should be below the rank of Associate Professor and not have received a comparable career development award. The selected scholars receive 50 percent salary support up to NIH salary cap guidelines and benefits for a period of three years.

### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNAL PEER REVIEW AT JOHNS HOPKINS**

The Office of the Assistant Provost for Research Administration will conduct the review of candidates to select one nominee from Johns Hopkins. Interested candidates should submit the materials listed below for internal review by 6 p.m. on **Friday, October 23, 2009**, to [malexander@jhu.edu](mailto:malexander@jhu.edu). Each applicant will receive a confirmation of receipt of their materials within 48 hours. If you do not receive such an acknowledgement, please contact me directly at: (410) 516-8734 or by e-mail. The selected candidate's preliminary application must be electronically submitted to the Greenwall Foundation no later than **Friday, November 20, 2009**.

**Applicants should submit these documents as one PDF in the following sequence:**

1. JHU Internal Submission Cover Sheet
2. Curriculum Vitae (Limit: five single-spaced pages)
3. Letter of Intent describing the proposed research, its significance, how it will be conducted, and the likelihood of its impact on public policy or clinical practice and a personal statement summarizing the objectives in the area of bioethics (Limit: three pages of text maximum; double-spaced, in 12-pt font with one inch margins)
4. Letter of recommendation from the applicant's department chair/director
