

EDWARD MALLINCKRODT JR. FOUNDATION AWARD PROGRAM 2009

The Edward Mallinckrodt Jr. Foundation was established in 1953 and provides awards three times a year “for the purpose of advancing knowledge in the various fields of medical and health research” These grants are start-up funds for established investigators or senior faculty to move research projects forward to the point of obtaining other independent funding or support for highly promising young investigators during a time when start-up funds are limited.

AWARD PROGRAM

Awards are made in the amount of \$50k - \$70k per year for a period of three years. Both basic science and clinical research proposals are considered. This Foundation does not support projects in progress and/or already receiving significant funding, and it will not provide funding beyond the initial three-year period. The following previous awards from the Mallinckrodt Foundation reflect its broad interest:

- Treatment of Autoimmune Disease by Sequential “Reeducation” of the Thymus
- Molecular Causes of Cardiac Hypertrophy and of Congestive Heart Failure
- The Effect of the Biological Clock Genes on the Body’s Circadian Rhythms
- Molecular Dissection of Myoblast Fusion
- A Multicenter, Double-Blind, Multi-dose, Within-Patient Study to Evaluate the Safety, Tolerance and Efficacy of MP-1177/10 Injection

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNAL PEER REVIEW AT JOHNS HOPKINS

Johns Hopkins is permitted to nominate three applications for this program. The deadline to submit preliminary applications for internal review is **Friday, July 10, 2009**. Interested applicants should submit their internal application to me at bsc2@jhu.edu with the subject line, “Mallinckrodt internal application—Aug. 2009.”

Please send the documents as **one PDF** in the following sequence:

- Curriculum vitae, including current external research support and publications

- Proposal with a sufficiently detailed description of the research project (two to four pages of text, doubled-spaced, 12-pt font with one-inch margins). Also include references for review by the medical Trustees beyond this text description
 - One-page lay summary
 - Letter from the department chair that describes the candidate's qualifications.
 - Budget outlining how the awarded funds will be utilized (one page maximum).
- NOTE:** This Foundation does not provide overhead.
