

SEARLE SCHOLARS PROGRAM (2009-2010)

The Searle Scholars Program aims to support high-risk research of outstanding young faculty in the biomedical sciences. This focus includes, but is not limited to, awards supporting research in biochemistry, cell biology, genetics, immunology, neuroscience, pharmacology, and related areas in chemistry, medicine, and the biological sciences. Applicants must be in the first or second year of their first appointment as an assistant professor on a tenure track.

FUNDING

Funding is \$300K during the course of a three-year period, with \$100,000 paid each year pending acceptance of an annual progress report. Up to 25% of an individual's salary may be charged to the grant, together with allowable fringe benefits. Total salary plus benefits charged to the Scholar may not exceed \$25,000.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNAL PEER REVIEW AT JOHNS HOPKINS

Johns Hopkins has been invited to submit two (2) applications for the Searle Scholars Program.

The deadline to submit preliminary applications for internal review is **4 p.m., Friday, July 17, 2009**. Interested applicants should send via e-mail their internal application to Barbara Christen at bsc2@jhu.edu, with the subject line of "Searle Scholars Program 2009."

Please submit the following documents in sequence as **one PDF**:

1. [JHU Limited submission cover sheet](#)
2. Abstract (one page, double-spaced)
3. Proposal (maximum of four pages text: 12-pt font and one-inch margins; figures, tables, and other reference material not included)
4. Curriculum vita/vitae of investigators, including current external research support and publications (two pages maximum, each investigator)
5. Budget (two pages maximum)

Within 48 hours, applicants can expect to receive an e-mail confirmation of receipt. If you
